Respectfulness: Team members will respect themselves, other team members, course staff and equipment.

- Respect team members and instructors - listen to other people and give everyone the chance to express their own opinions
- Provide constructive criticism towards ideas, not people.
- Use a polite and respectful tone at all times.
- Keep differences in opinion friendly and constructive. Outside disagreements should be left at the door. Seek mediation if resolution is needed.

Budget: Team members will only use project budget adhering to the 2.009 budget guidelines.

- Purchase items in accordance with the rules of 2.009
- Return items only if they were not used.

- Purchase items for a specific tasks that will benefit knowledge on a project-related topic or be used in the construction of a product model.

Curiosity: Team members will actively chase down any leads they think will make a better product

- Explore as many solutions as possible when problems arise.
- Take well-reasoned risks, tolerate failure as a learning opportunity, and try new things that can potentially benefit the overall product.

Cleanliness and Safety: Team members will promote health in all aspects of 2.009.

- Maintain a clean work environment wherever you work (this includes lab and other shops outside pappalardo).
- Stay to help clean up at the end of any lab activity/presentation.
- Keep lab clean, keep lab healthy.
- Use tools safely, asking for help if needed.
